## Key Points:

- The entered dog must be at least four months of age.
- Bitches in season will not be allowed to participate. If entered, bitch cannot participate, another dog may be substituted that is AKC registered.
- All dogs entered must have the proper lead and collar.
- A responsible adult <u>must</u> be present with child both inside and outside the ring. The adult to maintain control of the dog outside the ring.
- The safety of both the dogs and the Pee Wees inside and outside the ring is a primary concern.
- At the Judge's discretion, based on the size of the dog and the child, for safety purposes the
  adult may be asked to attach a second lead to the dog so both the child and adult will walk the
  dog together
